Nursing clinical core courses must be completed within 2 years.

Student must be at least 18 years of age when enrolled in clinical courses.

The nursing student will follow the Nursing Program Progression policy in the Student Nurse Handbook. General studies courses must be passed passed with a "C" or better in two attempts.

Graduation Requirements: All courses need to be passed with a "C" grade or higher

Criminal background check must be completed with negative results before starting the nursing clinical courses
